Federal Crop Insurance for winter canola is available across Oklahoma, Kansas, and Texas. Written agreements are no longer required in several counties. Hear the details from USDA-RMA.

Results will be presented from OSU, KSU, and Croplan Genetics variety trials; learn about new varieties and hybrids; **hear directly from several Oklahoma and Kansas growers who harvested canola in June.** Find out why some growers prefer swathing and some prefer direct harvesting. Hear from growers who “pushed” their canola this year instead of swathing it.

Other topics include: seed supplies: conventional and Roundup Ready®; how to grow canola; how to kill rescuegrass, rye, ryegrass, cheat, and other weeds; how to scout for and control aphids; economics of production compared to wheat; plenty of question and answer time.
